In early April, the Pacific Humanitarian team hosted the regional MISP training of trainers workshop, in partnership with UNFPA, bringing together MAs, UNFPA staff from the sub-regional office and country posts and SROP staff. IPPF SROP was also represented at two key regional health meetings, ensuring that SRHR remains on the agenda as a crucial component of health services.

We also had some exciting visitors this month. The SROP team was thrilled to welcome Dr Jameel Zamir, who joined ESEAOR as Director of Programs this year, to the Pacific for the first time, while the Kiribati Women and Children's Support Centre, supported by Kiribati Family Health Association, hosted Dr Sharman Stone, Australian Ambassador for Women and Girls during her visit to Kiribati.

Regional Health Meetings

IPPF SROP was represented at not one but two key regional meetings on health in the Pacific. With ongoing opposition to SRHR globally, it is crucial that IPPF continues to advocate for the inclusion of comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services within Pacific health services.

65th PIHOA Meeting, Palau

From 25th to 29th March, Michael Sami, SROP Organisational Development Manager, attended the 65th Pacific Islands Health Officers Association (PIHOA) Executive Board Meeting in Palau. The annual meeting brings together PIHOA members, key national and regional stakeholders, development partners, as well as representatives from US federal agencies. It provides an opportunity to discuss regional and national health issues and to plot the way forward.

Michael presented on the need to promote SRHR across development and humanitarian settings in the Pacific and hosted a lively discussion.

7th Pacific Heads of Health Meeting, Nadi

From 3rd to 5th April, Karen Hill, Director of Programs and Operations, Pacific, attended the 7th Pacific Heads of Health meeting in Nadi hosted by the Pacific Community (SPC). With representatives from governments across the Pacific as well as NGOs, CSO, universities and other partners, the meeting focuses on providing recommendations to the Pacific Health Ministers Meeting.

The 2019 meeting addressed a wide-range of health issues including reproductive and maternal health, and the importance of Universal Health Coverage. With representatives from UNFPA, PIRMCCM and IPPF, reproductive health was well-covered although there was strong opposition at times.





Dr Sharman Stone Visits Kiribati Women and Children's Support Centre

On 16th April, Dr Sharman Stone, Australia's Ambassador for Women and Girls, visited Kiribati Women and Children's Support Centre (KWCSC) as part of her trip to Kiribati. Supported by Kiribati Family Health Association (KFHA), KWCSC provides support to survivors of gender based violence across Kiribati.

Norma Yeeting, Executive Director of KFHA, met with Dr Stone during her visit to KWCSC and the two participated in a round table discussion with women working to promote gender equality on 17th April. Norma shared experiences from KFHA's work and the challenges they face in promoting SRHR in Kiribati.

Dr Stone is also an external advisor to IPPF's Governing Council.

VFHA & Wan Smol Bag

Vanuatu Family Health Association (VFHA) and Wan Smol Bag, a development theatre group which raises awareness of key issues including SRHR in Vanuatu, hosted a cultural ceremony on 5th April to promote cooperation and coordination going forward. The two organisations are the main providers of SRH and contraceptive services in Vanuatu.

The ceremony was held at the Wan Smol Bag nutrition centre and culminated in the exchange of mats and kava before staff, volunteers and management of both organisations shared kava. This represents the next stage in the relationship between the two organisations who have agreed to work more closely together going forward.

In Brief

CIFWA Age of Consent Analysis

The Cook Islands Family Welfare Association (CIFWA) is finalising their situational analysis of the age of consent in Cook Islands. This research will inform advocacy activities going forward to promote the sexual and reproductive rights of all Cook Islanders and ensure that CIFWA can continue to provide high quality SRH services to all their clients.

RFHAF at the Coke Games

The Reproductive and Family Health Association of Fiji (RFHAF) set up a booth at the annual Coca Cola Games, in Suva, an athletic tournament which saw over 2,000 athletes from across Fiji compete. RFHAF provided SRHR information to competitors and spectators, and promoted Sexual Assault Awareness Month. Earlier this month, RFHAF, in partnership with the local police post, also hosted a morning wellness walk to raise awareness of sexual assault and the importance of consent.





Humanitarian

Regional MISP Training of Trainers

The Pacific Humanitarian team held the regional MISP training of trainers from 8th to 12th April, in Nadi. Hosted in partnership with UNFPA, the workshop brought together program and clinical staff from the nine Pacific MAs, as well as representatives from SROP, UNFPA's sub-regional office and country posts, from as far a field as the Federated States of Micronesia. Keya Saha-Chaudhury, Senior Capacity Development Advisor, joined from the Bangkok Humanitarian Hub to support the facilitation team.

The workshop focused on the delivery of MISP in humanitarian settings and leveraged the participants' wealth of experience of responding to crises around the world.



SPRINT Mid-Term Review

The SPRINT 3 mid-term review is currently underway. The purpose is to review the performance of the program and discuss how implementation can be improved and be best aligned with other incoming programs. Humanitarian Deputy Director, Robyn Drysdale, and MTR consultant, Tamara Kwarteng, visited Vanuatu Family Health Association from $15^{th} - 18^{th}$ April for data collection – the VFHA response to the eruptions of Manaro volcano on Ambae island was chosen to be one of two case studies for the review.

Community Disaster and Climate Risk Management Program, Samoa

From 1st to 5th April, Samoa Family Health Association (SFHA) worked with key partners under the Disaster Management Office's Community Disaster and Climate Risk Management Program to empower communities in Samauga, Savai'l, to prepare for and respond to humanitarian disasters. Leiloa Asaasa, SFHA Program Manager, presented on the importance of SRH in emergencies.
